Twenty percent of project funds will be allocated to U.S. intercultural ministries, 11 percent will be used for project promotion, and 9 percent will be applied to the Great Commission Fund.

AFRICA REGION

1. Congo: \$10,000. Equipping Students Who Will Study Abroad to Minister in Their Host Country

This project will equip students to minister in the countries where they will go to do their university studies. Congolese students are able to receive full scholarships to study abroad. A short, intensive training program would teach these students how to live their Christian faith in the context of a non-Christian environment and how to reach out to the lost in their host country.

2. Congo: \$10,000. Scholarships for Women to attend the All Africa AWM Conference 2012 Scholarship money is needed to assist 30 Congolese women to attend the All Africa Alliance Women's Conference in 2012 in Angola. This conference will be spiritually beneficial in the lives of these women as they are equipped to reach their country for Christ as well as give them a vision to the needs beyond their countries where the gospel is not heard.

3. Burkina Faso: \$2,000. Evangelism Training for Pastor's Wives

As church planting efforts in Burkina Faso move forward in unreached areas, it is vital that the pastor's wife be able to share in the efforts to reach these villages for Christ. Equipping these wives with practical skills: how to teach reading and writing, sewing, water purification, and first aid will enable them to have a contact point with the other women in these new villages. The funds raised for this project would provide materials for the classes, the cost of guest speakers and transportation costs for the pastors' wives to visit villages and see firsthand how these methods are being used to win people to Christ. Approximately 100 pastor's wives can be trained in this program.

4. Burkina Faso: \$3,800. Training National Pastors to use Discipleship Material Master Life This project is two-fold. 1.) 500 copies of the existing materials need to be reproduced. 2.) The second aspect is to effectively train Bible School students how to use this material through four training sessions.

5. Burkina Faso: \$12,500. Training Leaders through Theological Education by Extension Giving a solid biblical and doctrinal foundation to church leaders by means of programmed text courses called TEE is a useful tool to train pastors at the grass roots level. This grant would provide the funds to reprint the following five courses: OT Survey, NT Survey, Alliance Doctrine, Holy Spirit, and Marriage and the Family. The courses could then be taught in the villages.

6. Mali, Koutiala Hospital: \$10,000. Training Nurses who are Called to Evangelize. The training program will consist of one year in Bible School and three years earning a nursing degree. The nurse will then be deployed to a village where they are planting a church. The nursing training will allow the nurse to support himself and provide a service to the community. The Bible School training will allow them to share the gospel and plant a church in their village. The grant of \$10,000. will provide training for two nurses.

7. Mali: \$7,500. Sharpening Your Interpersonal Skills for Key Church Leaders

This course of study will train participants in biblical relational skills like encouragement, conflict management, the battle for moral purity and helping others through grief. Funds will be used to jump-start the workshop study program.

8. Cote d'Ivoire: \$19,000. Housing at the Seminary called FATEAC to Equip African Leaders The seminary is located on the outskirts of the large city of Abidjan. Public transportation from major residential areas to the seminary is unreliable, time-consuming and expensive. Rather than commuting, the seminary would like to build apartments where families with young children can stay on campus. Since the school is made up of students from fifteen different African countries, it is vital that the seminary families have the support of each other. This would allow the women to attend the school. Monies for this project will be used to build one of the apartments needed.

9. Conakry, Guinea: \$10,000. Training Nationals to be Missional

This project will provide seminars for both men and women leaders to be trained in evangelizing the unreached people groups of this area. The

training will equip these leaders to have the ability to minister in the areas where they are planting churches.

ASIA/PACIFIC REGION

1. Cambodia: \$10,000. Leadership Development between Pastors and Emerging and Young Adult Leaders

It is imperative that future leaders of the Cambodian church get proper training. In the next ten to fifteen years the current leadership will be retiring. We need the new leaders to be passionate about the Lord and His work. These funds will provide the capability to hold two-day training seminars to meet this need.

2. Cambodia: \$1,400. Mission Trip for the Young Women's Ministry

The national women's committee will take 20 young women from the three regions of the Cambodian Church on a trip to cast the vision for the next generation of women's leaders by giving them an expanded opportunity for observation and ministry experience in the villages.

3. Indonesia: \$10,000. Continuing Education for Pastors

Funds will be used to provide scholarships for leaders to attend conferences and to buy resources such as books and DVDs so the pastors and educators can further hone their skills in order to maintain and increase their effectiveness as salt and light to the world around them.

4. India: \$25,000. Equipping Key Indian Leaders to Reach Least Reached Groups in India India has the largest number of least reached people groups in the world and continues to grow rapidly, doubling in population every 30 years. The hope is to develop an evangelistic and church multiplication movement among at least five of the most unengaged or under-engaged people groups, numbering at least one million people. To make this vision a reality funds are needed to provide financial assistance for leaders to be trained in theological institutions and in non-formal training seminars and workshops.

5. Mongolia: \$25,000. Equipping Mongolians for Ministry in Church and Society The church in Mongolia is young and marginal in society. A key

strategy of The Alliance is to make a significant contribution to equipping Mongolian Christians for leadership in the church, in mission and in society. The funding will be used to support workshops, seminars, modular courses and regular monthly training sessions for a five year period.

6. Equipping Leaders to Reach the Unreached: \$10,000.

God is doing a new thing in this region as we see people coming to Christ. The ability to network within this framework is crucial. Five nationalities are represented in this movement. It is important to provide gatherings where these peoples can be encouraged and strengthened in their faith and learn how they can minister in countries outside their own area. This should be a launching pad for a missiological outbreak of Christ in this area of the world.

7. Fish Farm Dorm: \$5,000.

Currently the 50 acre fish farm business already established is training leaders to live in their communities and bring people to Christ. These farms are able to be produced in their local settings providing them the ability to minister. The purpose of the fish farm is to contextualize the message of Christ and to immerse those attending the sessions in the inductive study scripture. They will discuss how to live out scripture in a practical way. A dorm is needed to house those coming to the seminars and these funds will provide that need.



Europe/Middle East Region

1. Training for Women: \$2,800.

Practical Biblical Training for Majority-Background Women Believers

Two or three day seminars will be taught by women from the area to equip women in their local context how to reach out to women and disciple others.

2. Germany: \$16,000. Scholarship for Students for Study in Reaching Unreached People Groups

These funds will enable two students to receive the training they need to become part of church planting teams in unreached areas. During their training, they will also be mentored by a seasoned leader and will be assigned to have practical ministry experience as part of their training.

3. Medallion: \$12,000. Curriculum and Teacher Training to Reach Children

The Medallion Ministry creates and distributes age appropriate children's curriculum in keeping with the core values of The Alliance in the language of this country. Women in the churches are then trained on how to use this material. These funds will produce the new curriculum and provide teacher training for the congregations in order to reach children for the Kingdom of God.

4. Kosovo: \$16,000. Entrust Women-to-Women Leadership

The main purpose of this project is to train Kosovar women who have leadership potential in the key areas of Bible knowledge, ministry skills, evangelism, and character qualities so they can in turn entrust what they have learned to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others. The project funds will go to the translation and printing of four courses for this ministry.

5. Training Teams of Women for Ministry in an Unreached Country: \$10,000.

This team of four to six women will be sent to bring spiritual encouragement, practical ministry training, practical training for first aid, women's and children's health issues in a remote area of the country.

6. Russia: \$20,000. Training Lay Women in Biblical Counseling Ministries

The experience has been that the severe challenges faced by women in this country are better handled through the church context rather than professional counseling. Kuben Evangelical Christian University provides an extension course in Christian Counseling that can be done by women living at home who travel several times a year for intensive courses. As they return to their church after each course, they can begin to implement what they have learned. The program of study requires attending nine sessions over a three year period. This project will provide partial scholarships to ten women at \$2,000. each.



Latin America Region

1. Training Centers for Nationals Who Want to Minister Cross-Culturally: \$5,000. This fund will provide scholarships for 10 students at \$500. each. These classes will be held in each country and will incorporate A.B. Simpson's original vision of raising up workers for the harvest with urgency. Each student will be coached by experienced leaders with cross-cultural expertise to help them through each step of the process to get to the harvest field.

2. Latin American Graduate School of Theology FATELA: Women in Seminary: \$9,000. These scholarships will provide half grants for youth pastor's wives and other women wishing to study in the seminaries in the mission's training division as cross-cultural candidates.

3. Member Care Training for Latin American Cross-Cultural Workers Sending Churches and Schools: \$11,500.

The goal of this project is to create a practical and reproducible training materials that will help churches and Bible Schools know how to select, send and care for their cross-cultural workers on the field. The course would include power points, video clips, a workbook and a CD of all of the materials. Funds will be used to translate and print workbooks, produce 2,000 CD's and develop a resource website.

4. Mexico: \$17,000. Developing National Pastors

Equipping, developing and training the pastors in Chiapas in a poor, regional area of Mexico needs to be a priority. Courses in leadership training, missions, and church planting are offered. These funds will help off-set the expenses of training these men.

5. Mexico: \$7,000. Translation and Printing of Materials for Women's Ministry Training These courses will be on discipleship, mentoring, and evangelism so that women will have the opportunity to be discipled, mentored, empowered and mobilized to play a key role in their cities for the sake of the Kingdom and the glory of God.

6. Uruguay: \$3,000. Regional Conferences for Pastors

Funds for this project will help to partially off-set the cost of sending pastors to regional meetings where they can be encouraged spiritually and trained for further ministry.

7. Dominican Republic: \$2,500. Women's Leadership Studies (WLS)

Workshops to train Alliance women Leaders will be held twice a year that would closely follow the WLS program in the United States. Funds will be used to produce materials, subsidy of travel and housing for women leaders and to help pay the expenses of the instructors.

8. Dominican Republic: \$2,000. Pastor's Libraries

Create opportunities for pastors and leaders to increase their effectiveness in training others by providing books and study materials that would be helpful in sermon preparation.

9. Dominican Republic: \$5,000. Prepare Leaders to Serve as International Workers in Partnership with Alliance World Fellowship Partner Churches.

The funds will be used to train two teachers in missions for our schools; for producing materials for courses on missions; provide instruction and materials on holding missions conferences each year for nearly 100 Dominican Alliance Churches.

All Regions: Undesignated Discretionary Funds: \$40,000. to be used by the International Missions Department to assist in needs that arise in any region of the world.
