

## AFRICA REGION

### 1. Mali: \$5,000. NOMA Deformity Surgery

This project will help Mali children from villages get maxillofacial surgery, specifically, tumor, trauma, reconstructive and congenital defects of the face. The children in these villages are notoriously neglected when they contract diseases due to the prevailing thought that they are 'replaceable'. Since relationships first are key to sharing the gospel and this can be combined with offering the surgery even if the family can only pay a little, we see the care of these patients as a good opportunity to not only show Christ's love, but explain it to them too.

### 2. Burkina Faso: \$6,000. Dorcas House

Dorcas House was opened in collaboration with the Burkina Alliance Women to help girls learn to read and write, develop intellectually, socially and spiritually, and to learn a trade. Every year Dorcas House is home to 20 girls. Dorcas House is looking for support to help feed and care for the girls as well as staff costs as they continue to work at creative self-sustaining initiatives.

### 3. Burkina Faso: \$42,000. Schooling Burkinabè

**Girls** This project has a vision to involve "older women" in the education of "younger women" (Titus 2:3-5) by creating a vocational school for uneducated girls at our proposed Widows' Center. Each year, over the next 5 years, 20 unschooled girls would be recruited. Widows would then be employed to teach them each weekday afternoon. Anticipated project costs would be \$39,000 for a 3-classroom school and \$3,000 for 20 sewing machines.

## ASIA/PACIFIC REGION

### 1. China: \$50,000. Elementary School for Autistic Children

China Professional Services has been partnering with two special education institutions to provide preschool-age rehabilitation to autistic children. Collectively, they serve 500-600 children through interventions and behavioral training each year. CPS would like to start an elementary school for school-age autistic children and focus on 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> graders in the beginning and gradually expand to 6<sup>th</sup> grade.

### 2. Thailand: \$25,500. The Doisaket Gospel

**Dormitory** The primary purpose of the Doisaket Gospel Dormitory home is to provide a place for the children of pastors who serve in the countryside villages. Due to the poor quality of countryside public schooling, many pastors do not want to live and serve in the villages because of their children. The Doisaket Gospel Dormitory home has been an answer to many pastors and their families.

### 3. Cambodia: \$25,000. Kachok Children's

**Ministry** This project presents a plan for the development of Kachok-language children's ministry materials with children's worker training and the construction of three children's ministry facilities beside existing churches.

## EUROPE/MIDDLE EAST REGION

### 1. **Russia: \$9,500. Curriculum for Russian Churches**

The goal for this project is to have a culturally appropriate children's church curriculum written and published. The lessons will be focused for small church use. There is currently no curriculum that can be used for a wide age gap of kids and with little supplies, but that very situation describes the majority of the Russia churches. With the funds a curriculum could be published and training seminars could be held in four cities.

### 2. **Russia: \$6,250. Inkerman Children's Camp**

Inkerman Children's Camp is held at no cost to the kids who wouldn't be able to attend otherwise. The camp would like to purchase equipment such as tents, tables, and chairs so that they can have the opportunity to minister to children throughout the year which they cannot currently do because they have to borrow the equipment.

### 3. **Bosnia: \$5,000. Center Activities for Children**

The community center in the city of Sarajevo is not only reach out to adults through English and other classes, they are also reaching out to children and their families through activities geared towards kids. A new reading program for kids is in the works. Funds from this project will be used to purchase materials, equipment, and for promotion of the children's program.

## LATIN AMERICA REGION

### 1. **Chile: \$7,000. OANSA (AWANA)**

A year long program is planned for 35 kids. The funds for this project will go towards implementation, equipment, and materials.

**2. Dominican Republic: \$10,000. Teacher Training Seminars** The funds for the Teacher Training Seminars will go towards cost of travel for teachers, a place to meet, training materials, and scholarship assistance for those who will attend.

**3. Dominican Republic: \$5,000. Cost of Curriculum Materials** This project allows for development of an area of specialized studies in the Alliance Bible Institute such as Christian Education, Children's Ministries, and preparing C.E. Directors for churches. Funds would be used for curriculum materials such as books for the library and teacher scholarship assistant.

**4. Dominican Republic: \$10,000. Evangelism and Discipleship Program** Help is needed in the growing children's camp ministry, materials for Vacation Bible School, and starting AWANA programs. The Discipleship program helps children to become strong, maturing Christians.

**5. Ecuador: \$30,000. Clean Water for the Forgotten Children** To supply Bio sand water filters to the isolated Indigenous communities in the Amazon Basin of Ecuador who still drink water from muddy rivers. To then provide medicine to de worm and de parasite each child. To show them that our God is a God who sees them and loves them and has a future for them.

**6. Paraguay: \$10,000. Children's Holistic Ministry** The potentials is for 200 children of needy families to receive a meal once a week, preventative and crisis dental care, eye screening, and basic school supplies. The gospel and Christian principles for living will be presented weekly and the churches will manage the ministry and will match the funds that are provided on a one-to three basis (for every three dollars that is provided, the churches must provide one dollar itself for the ministry).

**7. Uruguay, Montevideo: \$2,500. Laptop for presenting Parenting with Love and Logic seminars** This project is designed to directly influence children by providing parental training. This training improves the child/parent relationship by providing parents with useful skills in order to increase learning scenarios and foster a positive home environment. A laptop is imperative to be able to continue with these parenting classes.

## CAC REGION

**1. Children's Indoor Play Area: \$3,500.** The Children's Indoor Play Area will be an all-purpose community center especially for families. The second floor will be largely for children, with a morning preschool and a large area where we hope to put an indoor playground. It is our hope to bless the families of "Long Beach" by providing a safe place for their children and also a family-friendly environment where they can come and enjoy being together.

**2. Moms and Me: \$50,000. English Teaching and Compassion Ministries** Moms and me is an already established ministry that creates a fun environment for moms and their children to come and connect with people who can show them and share with them the love of Christ. The English Teaching money would be used to obtain a curriculum and put a program in place for teaching children. Compassion Ministries supplies gifts for children of poor families around Christmas and Easter. They have also done puppet type ministries in the community.

**3. Books 4 Kids \$26,387.** There is a strong need, in the countries of South East Asia, to translate Bible stories that are age and context appropriate for children. Sturdy, durable story books with simple text and colorful pictures (or coloring books with the stories of Bible characters) are ideal for making God's Word available to children of the majority faith here.
